## Quartet to Present Free Concert at Fairfield Glade Community Church

The Fairfield Glade Community Church will present a series of four Community Enrichment events during 2018. All events are free and open to the public, and will be staged in the church at 521 Snead Drive. A free-will offering will be collected at each event to support our guest artists, and to assist a local charity. The first event will take place on Sunday, February 25 at 3:00 PM, and will feature the Three Good-Looking Guys Quartet. Proceeds will be shared with Hospice of Cumberland County.

The quartet sings traditional and popular songs in the barbershop style. Their *a cappella* performances feature close harmonies and familiar melodies. The concert will spotlight songs from numerous musical genres, including spiritual/gospel, traditional barbershop, shake/rattle/roll, bebop/beach/blues and show business/cinema. The quartet will deliver stirring renditions of many fan favorites, including I'll Fly Away, Coney Island Baby, Come Go With Me, Darkness on the Delta, and Do You Hear the People Sing, to name but a few.

Tenor Richard "Buzz" Ziegler, a retired surgeon, is an accomplished musician. Buzz recently moved to Fairfield Glade from the Toledo, Ohio area where he performed in musical theatre. Buzz sings with the Cumberland County Community Chorus (CCCC), and sings tenor and plays handbells at Fairfield Glade United Methodist Church (FFGUMC). Buzz also plays French horn with the CC Community Band, and plays jazz piano for A Sleepin' Bee, a newly formed combo.

Lead Marty Gibson has performed in the Crossville area in many different musical groups for over 25 years. Marty was the Choral Director at Cumberland County High School, has taught voice and guitar, and is now the Director of the CCCC and Music Director at FFGUMC. Marty also sings and plays guitar and bass for the City Lites. Marty and Terry Ashburn sing and play guitar weekly as The Relics at several local restaurants.

Baritone Tom Liebert, a retired computer hardware/software engineer, moved to Fairfield Glade from New England. Tom performed in musical theater and belonged to several competitive barbershop choruses. In 2010 he sang with the Downeasters chorus at an international competition. Since moving to Tennessee, Tom has sung with the Plateau Chordsmen barbershop chorus, the CCCC, and at Carnegie Hall with the Festival Chorale. Tom currently sings tenor at FFGUMC.

Bass Bob Berghauser, an Air Force veteran and avid golfer, retired from the chemical industry. Bob moved to Fairfield Glade over a decade ago from Connecticut, where he was an accomplished barbershop quartetter and a frequent top-ten finisher at regional competitions. Since moving to Tennessee, Bob has sung with barbershop choruses in Monterey and Knoxville, as well as at Central Baptist Church and the CCCC.
