Ministerial Calling

My sense of being called was nurtured and affirmed as early as I can recall as a child. My home church community and family taught me a wide range of diverse teachings of the Bible as well as the traditions and history of the Christian faith, instilling a strong sense of ecumenism. After serving in the Army Veterinary Service, I finally entered the seminary and was ordained by the Roman Catholic Church, where I served faithfully and joyfully until I met my wife Lilly. We were welcomed into the UCC where I was once again called to serve in ordained ministry, and eventually as a Chaplain in the Air Force. My sense of being called is to trustingly fulfill humble servant-leadership modeled and guided by Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit.

Covenant

The UCC polity resonates strongly with what is reflected in the scriptures and what I have always felt in my heart. By serving collaboratively and cooperatively with a community of faith, we can all humbly grow together

Counseling is one of my strengths. I have been highly effective in helping marital couples and in dealing with issues of loss, grief, and mourning. I'm adaptable, a team builder, welcome diversity, consensus forming, and enjoy working with interfaith and ecumenical situations.

Positive:

Highly intelligent, impeccably articulate, strong leader, compassionate, genuinely caring, profoundly pastoral, high integrity, exceptionally capable, deeply devout, fluent in Spanish, remarkably suited to pastoral ministry, gifted pastoral caregiver and listener, thoughtful and centered on connecting with others, attentive to detail, understands and embraces spiritual and religious diversity, learns from his mistakes, seeks advice, does well with balancing ego with requirements of the job.

Improvement Needed:

Continue with education and experience to improve with age, his style of learning in taking time to meticulously think through and process subject matter, tends to overextend himself personally and forget to take time to rest.

INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

Following is a synopsis of Rev Janecek's responses to a few of the Pastor Search Committee's questions asked during his interview on February 25.

Q What is your style of preaching, traditional, conservative, progressive, other, and why?

A I believe in engaging the listeners, having them find meaning in the sermon, moving them in some way. I also preach to myself because I need the meaning, teaching, and engaging in my life. I research and study the text of the liturgical calendar as well as what's going on and important in the world. And find depth in coupling the text with relevance to the world, community, individuals. I am not there to entertain, but rather to be thought-provoking, to be fresh and to find new opportunities, rather than canned preaching. The world is always changing. There is only one today and one tomorrow. I will bring humor to my sermons (often self-deprecating). Saying that, not all sermons or texts lend themselves to humor – they need to be somber. The voice of God should be touching our lives and we should be embracing all. I would say I'm more progressive and liberal, though not aggressive – no banners, stickers, protests. I would write a letter to my conference on an issue I felt strongly about. I am not a Bible literalist. Some pastors follow the liturgical calendar to the point of ignoring what is going on, what is needed. It is important to articulate what we're thinking in terms of Christian faith. It is important to facilitate the thinking process, bridging the world affecting us and tradition.

Q What is your understanding of our church as being Board-led?

A UCC churches are primarily congregational, a core group of laity can hire and fire. This is specific to the UCC, we personify that. We all have ownership of "our" church.

Q How do you see yourself working with the Board?

A I believe myself to be a strong leader – I won't be a functionary. This should be a collaborative, team effort, with pastor as spiritual leader. The Board and I are all leaders. Each is one leader among others. The congregation is the final governing body. We all need spiritual leadership

Q How do you feel about having voice but no vote?

A Voting is okay, but the greatest need is in coming together. I, as others, can voice my ideas and concerns. A good pastor is a good leader. The Board changes every few years. The pastor gives continuity – shaping the church by understanding and knowledge. Leadership is not a title. Sometimes saying little can mean a lot. Sometimes an outside, objective voice is needed, and the pastor can provide that voice or new perspective. If an idea is best for the church, he believes they will recognize that. There should be dialogue for every decision.

Q What attracted you to our church?

A Strong lay leadership. A niche here that is unique. The interdenominational aspect and atmosphere – there is a richness in all denominations. The desire for both unity and diversity. Very welcoming.

Q How would you manage church conflict?

A Conflict is not a bad word. Conflict is who we are. The key is in the process of dealing with the issue. If you run from it, it's still there. "Breaking windows" makes it worse. Some conflict is good and important – respect has to be there. Trust and the "speed of trust" takes time and effort to build. Through a process of respect, understanding, vulnerability, candor, authenticity, coming to resolution, and a clear knowledge of that resolution, trust can come about.
