Church Finances

The summary of the current income and expense status for 2018 through October 2018 is as follows:

Please keep in mind that the numbers above <u>only reflect what has been brought in and spent in 2018</u>. The Church is not in a financial crisis. However, we are spending assets that have accumulated over the past few years. <u>Please, please, please look at the Balance Sheet posted in the Fellowship Hall to see the assets the Church has.</u>

READ THE NOTES TO FULLY UNDERSTAND THE NUMBERS ABOVE!!!

Notes:

- 1. The General Fund is the operating funds to run the Church. *Note: The negative position in the General Fund will continue to grow because money will have to be transferred to cover the shortfall in the PIF account.*
- 2. The Missions Fund income is from designated contributions from Church members, the sale of Food City Cash Cards, Kroger charity program contributions, and Dimes for Missions. Expenses are distributions to charities and bank charges for counting coins. The transfer amount is the money moved from the General Fund to Missions as part of the Church support to Missions.
- 3. The Property Improvement Fund (PIF) income is from designated donations from Church members. PIF expenses are any property and facility expenses not covered by day-to-day maintenance activity. *Note: The negative position in the PIF difference will eventually have to be transferred from the General Fund to make up the shortfall. This difference will go to zero when that happens.*
- 4. Pass-Thru Fund is to account for money that comes through the Church but is not used to cover Church expenses. It is primarily for items such as special disaster collections, NIN/ Peacekeeping, One Great Hour of Sharing, Christmas Joy, Men's Fellowship, Women's Fellowship, etc. *Note: The Pass-Thru Fund is receiving much more activity this year than in the past because the income and expenses for the Faith Development classes go thru this fund. The expenses for the purchase of books occur before the income from the sale of books to class attendees is realized.*
- 5. Transfer is the term used to move money from one fund to another fund. Transfers are generally from the General Fund to the Missions Fund and the Property Improvement Fund. For instance, money is transferred from the General Fund to the Missions Fund on a quarterly basis to meet the congregation approved budget for Missions.
- 6. Difference = Income Expense + Transfers

A complete picture of all the assets of the Church (balance sheet), 2018 income and expenses, and 2018 budget status are posted on the Church Events Bulletin Board in the Fellowship Hall.

- 1. Call to order and Opening Prayer: Having declared a quorum, President Jim Hansen called the meeting to order. Dwight Wages offered an opening prayer.
- 2. Agenda review and revisions: Jim added one item to the agenda: Under old business, add Item d. Approve advertising for bell ringers in Messenger. Ralph requested under new business, expand Item g. to include "Council of Churches". Dwight asked to add under new business, Item i. Status of stained glass windows.
- **3.** Approval of October Minutes: strike "everything" and add "current expenditures" under Treasurers' Report; Ralph Seeh moved to approve minutes as amended. Al Joseph seconded the motion and motion carried.
- 4. Treasurer's report: The report has been placed on file for audit. Dennis Flynn moved to approve the narrative and numbers as presented for the 2019 budget to be included in the December Messenger. Judy Moore seconded the motion and motion carried.
- 5. Membership Report: Jim Hansen: We have 254 members. We have 116 pledges for \$218,060 of which \$181,491.00 has been collected.
- 6. Pastor's Report: Pastor James: all is well

7. Committee Reports

- a) Christian Response: Judy Moore: no report
- b) Columbarium Trust: Nancy Shepler: no report. We will meet November 15.
- c) Community Enrichment: Dwight Wages: Memorial Concert this Sunday. Everything set is set for the concert. Programs in February, April are set. Flag Day celebration is in process.
- d) Finance: Jim Hansen: We have \$33,918.00in the endowment fund and \$111,167 .00 in reserve fund. The Stewardship letter be mailed to Members and Associate Members only. We will revise the pledge cards to give an option for pledging to the Endowment Fund and/or Reserve Fund in addition to the General Fund.
- e) **Memorial:** Dennis Flynn: We are ready for the Memorial Concert this Sunday.
- f) Missions: Ralph Seeh: \$3500 and \$2925 sent to agencies.
- g) Nominating: Dwight Wages: no report
- h) **Parish Life:** Carolyn Caldwell: Thanksgiving potluck will begin registration this Sunday.
- i) Pastor Parish Relations: Roy Koskinen: On October 22 we want to make a presentation to congregation as to duties of committee.
- i) **Personnel:** Al Joseph: This week we are working on contracts. We have not found a new choir director as of this date and so far we've had no response for the advertisement of this position.
- k) **Property and Facilities:** Al Joseph: All the inspections went well. The bill for the cracked Heat Exchanger totaled \$1,800 but this also included other maintenance issues that he completed while here that day. It was noted that the AED unit has corroded batteries.
- 1) Strategic Planning: Fred Wong: We request permission to address the congregation to explain all the projects and what has been budgeted and what is deferred. We want to tell the congregation what SPC does. Jim stated that in a conversation with Gene Pino that day that SPC was satisfied with the Boards position that these projects were not denied but merely deferred for at least another year.
- m) Technology & Communications: Roy Koskinen: We had a meeting in October.
- n) Visitor Member Outreach: Susan Milledge: We will be meeting next Tuesday. We have one new member. We are working to change friendship pads and updating our SOP.
- o) Worship & Music: Nancy Nowacki: 20th Council of Churches event planned; December 2 will be the Community Chorus concert.

8. Old Business

- a) Gene Pino informed Jim that he no longer needed this action as he now understands that the Board deferred some of the 2019 projects rather than denying them.
- b) Jim Hansen reported that 9 people have expressed interest in serving on ERT through this years' Time and Talent survey but, so far no one has expressed interest in leading this committee. Jim will call them and try to schedule a meeting to get this committee going.
- c) Jim Hansen made the following motion: I move that the Board approve Property and Facilities spending \$1,500.00 to make repairs to the heating unit for the Narthex due to a crack in that unit's Heat Exchanger. Fred Wong seconded the motion and motion carried.
- d) Nancy Burleson wants permission to advertise Plateau Bell Ringers concerts. We need more information before deciding.

9. New Business

- a) On the newly designed pledge card, members will now have the ability to pledge towards the Endowment Fund and/or Reserve Fund in addition to the General Fund. Dwight moved to accept the letter and pledge card as presented with a second by Ralph. It was noted that we have to change the date on the letter due to the Christmas Cantata. After further discussion, it was recommended the date be changed to the 16th. Dwight rescinded his motion and Ralph rescinded his "second". Dwight then made a motion approve the letter to clarify the pledge to emphasize "general contribution and the opportunity to contribute to endowment and/or reserve" and change the date to the 16th. Fred seconded the motion and the motion carried
- b) The Board acted on a Property Use Permit allowing the Gentle Yoga program to expand to include both Tuesday's and Thursday's (9:30-10:30 both days). Susan Milledge moved to accept the proposal. Nancy Nowacki seconded the motion and motion carried.
- c) Susan Milledge made a motion to accept the request from Missions to send out a letter asking for donations for December's Christmas Joy Fund". Dwight Wages seconded the motion and the motion carried.
- d) Dwight Wages moved to approve the 2019 proposed committee chair /member listing as presented including all the members who need extension approval for beyond 3 years' of service. Roy Koskinen seconded the motion and the motion passed.
- e) Dwight moved to accept the changes to the Tri-fold as presented by Community Relations with the caveat that the quality match the current Tri-fold. Nancy Nowacki seconded the motion and motion carried.
- f) The board discussed the length of membership on some of the committees. No decision was made but discussions will continue with the Committee Chair/Board Member meeting next week.
- g) We need 2019 Delegates for SEC/UCC and Council of Churches. One of our newest congregational members has volunteered to be a delegate to Council of Churches.
- h) Important dates in November for Board Members:
 - ~ November 15: Quarterly Committee Chair/Board Meeting
 - November 18: November Congregational Meeting election of Board Members and Nominating Committee member and presentation of 2019 budget
 - November 18: Immediately following the Congregational Meeting, the 2019 Board will convene into the Organizational meeting to elect Board Officers for 2019.
- i) The Stained glass project was deferred until 2020 but a Church Member has volunteered to fully fund this project in 2019. To move forward with this deferred project, requires Board approval. Properties & Facilities will present pictures of stained glass project for approval at December's Board meeting.

Closing Prayer: Dwight Wages offered a closing prayer.

Adjournment: Al Joseph moved to adjourn. Nancy Shepler seconded the motion and motion carried.
